

AFFIDAVIT OF [REDACTED]

I, [REDACTED] declare as follows:

I have personal knowledge of the facts sworn to herein and if called as a witness to testify thereto could competently do so of my own personal knowledge.

1. On the evening of January 14, 2000, I had dinner with [REDACTED] and Linda Adanalian. We were discussing what we were doing recently. Linda said she had been down south with her kids visiting her sister. Linda said things were miserable at home with Mark and she wanted to give herself and the kids a break from the situation.

2. That evening Linda told [REDACTED] and me that if anything should happen to her, we should check it out and be suspicious of Mark.

3. I just didn't know how to respond. I made some joke about a scenario of an obvious hit, like her being shot by machine guns. Then I said for sure she could count on us to point the blame in Mark's direction.

4. Then Linda again said that we really would need to check it out if something happened to her. She said no one would ever believe anything bad about Mark. She said Mark was like O.J. Simpson. Everyone likes him and he is so affable and smiling no one would suspect him, ever. She reminded us that no one saw and heard him at home like she and the kids did.

5. I know there was more discussion of what she was going to do about the situation, but I don't remember the specifics.

6. That night was the last time I saw Linda alive. I spoke to her on the phone briefly a week or so later when she called to ask the name of a beauty salon in Clovis. I gave her the name and phone number and told her I would talk to her later.

7. To the best of my ability I have accurately recounted the discussion that occurred on January 14, 2000.

Linda Adanalian was a close friend.

On the evening of January 14, 2000, [REDACTED], Linda Adanalian, and myself met at Bennigan's in Clovis for dinner. From past conversations, where we shared confidences, I was aware of numerous problems with her husband Mark. I knew they were increasing in their frequency.

Linda specifically stated that evening, "He (referring to Mark) is like O.J. Simpson". She specifically stated, "If anything should ever happen to me..." and followed it with a request to look into it.

In the weeks following our dinner conversation and prior to her death, Linda's behavior and our conversation indicated that her situation was not getting any better.

Although I did not know Linda's family, after her death, I approached her sister and Linda's parents wishing to share my concerns.
